This Reader consists of diverse writings about Gould Farm, the nation’s oldest residential rehabilitation community for those with persistent mental illness. Informed by a Christianity that was neither sectarian nor doctrinaire, steeped in the Sermon on the Mount, Will Gould founded the Farm in 1913. Throughout its history, the Farm assisted refugees during World War II, hosted civil rights activists in the 1950s and 1960s, and sponsored Vietnamese refugees in the 1970s. More recently, it hosted a family which lost a loved-one in Iraq. *100 Years of Service Through Community* includes essays, letters, and book excerpts about Gould Farm written over the last 100 years including pieces by theologian James Luther Adams, author Rosemary Antin, sociologist Henrik F. Infield, Haverford College’s Douglas V. Steere, and Appalachian Trail founder Benton MacKaye.

Steven K. Smith grew up on Gould Farm, where his parents lived and worked. He later returned to the Farm and now sits on the Farm’s Board of Directors. He is an investigator with the Office of the Public Defender, Winchester, Virginia, where he is also a member of the local National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI).
